Q11.

- For a scaled resizing, use drag and drop by selecting one of the corner handles and while pressing Shift key drag the handle to its new position.
- To control the size of the object, select **Format** → **Object** → **Position and Size** from the menu bar.
- Select Position and Size dialog box to adjust the width and height independently.
- If the **Keep ratio** option is selected, then the two dimensions also adjust for proportion to be maintained to have a scaled resizing.



Q12.

The Freeze Panes tool allows you to lock your column and/or row headings so that, when you scroll down or over to view the rest of your sheet, the first column and/or top row remain on the screen.

When we click on More Settings, it displays Link to source data.

It is used to link the data. Any value if modified in the source range then automatically will get updated in the target range. The corresponding cell references in the target range are inserted in consecutive rows which are ordered. If this option is not selected the consolidated report will not get updated when we edit the data in sheets.

Q17.
